ABOUT BELLWETHER DISTRICT HOLDINGS, LLC ("BDH")

BDH owns approximately nine miles of pipelines located in Philadelphia and Delaware County, Pennsylvania.

WHAT DOES BDH DO IF A LEAK OCCURS?

To prepare for the event of a leak, pipeline companies regularly communicate, plan and train with local emergency responders. Upon the notification of an incident or leak, the pipeline company will immediately dispatch trained personnel to assist emergency responders.

Pipeline operators and emergency responders are trained to protect life, property, and facilities in the case of an emergency. Pipeline operators will take steps to minimize the amount of product that leaks by isolating the affected section of pipeline where the emergency has occurred.

MAINTAINING SAFETY AND INTEGRITY OF PIPELINES

BDH has developed an extensive number of pipeline safety procedures and invests significant time and capital maintaining the integrity of its pipeline systems. BDH takes significant safety measures such as utilizing on-ground personnel to continually monitor pipeline systems to identify potential dangers.

PRODUCTS TRANSPORTED

Product: Hazardous Liquids [Such as: Butane, Propane, Diesel Fuel, Jet Fuel, Gasoline, and other refined products]

Leak Type: Liquid

Vapors: Initially heavier than air and spread along ground and collect in low or confined areas. Vapors may travel to source of ignition and flash back. Explosion hazards indoors, outdoors or in sewers.

Health Hazards: Inhalation or contact with material may irritate or burn skin and eyes. Fire may produce irritating, corrosive and/or toxic gases. Vapors may cause dizziness or suffocation. Runoff from fire control or dilution water may cause pollution.

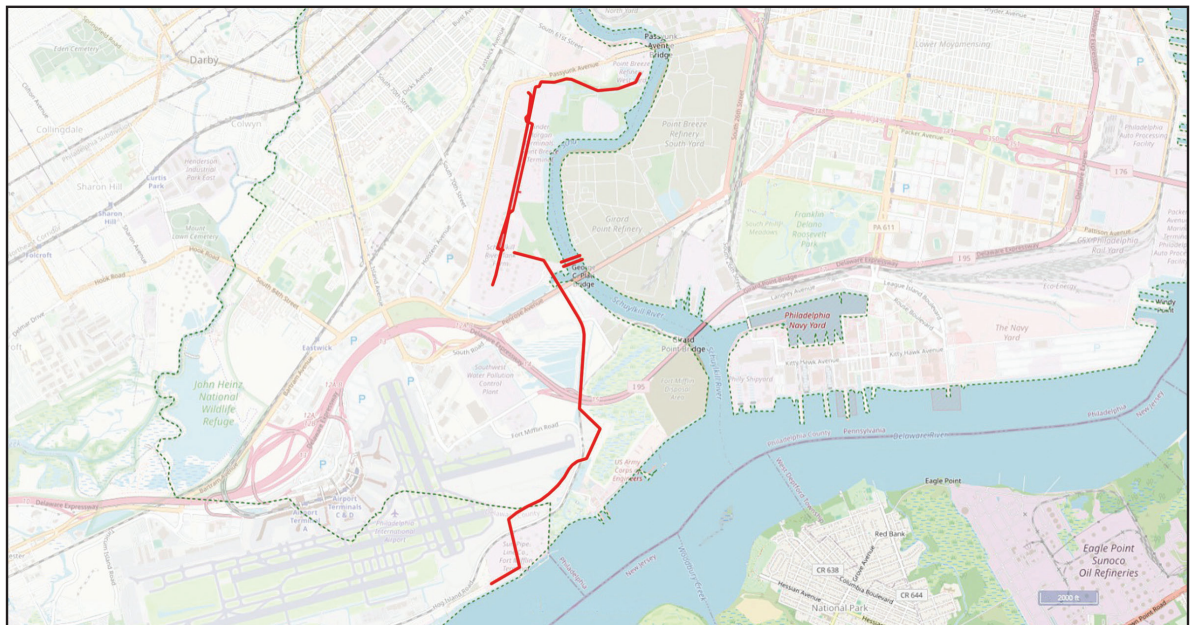
