- Notify Foothills by calling the emergency number listed in this brochure.
- Do not attempt to operate any pipeline valves.

PRODUCTS TRANSPORTED IN YOUR AREA

PRODUCT	LEAK TYPE	LIQUID AND VAPORS
CRUDE OIL	Liquid	Highly flammable and keep away from heat, sparks, hot surfaces, open flames, or other sources of ignition. Avoid breathing vapor and always use adequate ventilation. Vapors may burn in the open or explode in confined spaces when mixed with air and exposed to source of ignition. Flammable vapors may travel long distances along the ground before reaching a source of ignition and flashing back.
HEALTH HAZARDS	Will be easily ignited by heat, sparks, hot surfaces, open flame, or other ignition sources and contains petroleum distillates. May be harmful if inhaled. May cause cancer and genetic defects. May cause irritation of the respiratory system, throat, and lungs, headache, dizziness, drowsiness, loss of coordination, fatigue, nausea, and labored breathing. Avoid prolonged or repeated liquid, mist, and vapor contact with eyes, skin, and respiratory tract.
