Please read this material carefully so you are aware of the potential hazards associated with the pipelines, can identify and respond to a potential pipeline emergency, and know how to contact PDC to report a safety concern.

WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF A NATURAL GAS PIPELINE LEAK?

- Blowing or hissing sound
- Dust blowing from a hole in the ground
- Continuous bubbling in wet or flooded areas
- Gaseous or hydrocarbon odor
- Dead or discolored vegetation in a green area

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I SUSPECT A PIPELINE LEAK?

1. Evacuate the area and prevent anyone from entering
2. Abandon any equipment being used near the area
3. Do not start/turn off motor vehicles/ electrical equipment
4. Avoid introducing any sources of ignition to the area (such as cell phones, pagers, 2-way radios)
5. Call 911 or contact local fire or law enforcement
6. Notify the pipeline company

EXCAVATION SAFETY

While every precautionary measure is taken to safeguard pipelines, accidents can and do occur. Simple activities such as installing a mail box or flagpole, landscaping, fence construction, and other excavation-type activities can cause damage to the pipeline and its protective coating.

The federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811, was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on excavation projects **Always call 811 before you dig.**

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN AVAILABILITY
