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OVERVIEW

Boardwalk Petrochemical Pipeline, LLC (BPP) operates the Evangeline Pipeline. The Evangeline system is an approximately 180-mile bi-directional interstate pipeline. Evangeline transports ethylene between Port Neches, Texas and Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where it connects with the Boardwalk Louisiana Midstream’s (BLM) ethylene distribution system and storage facilities at the Choctaw Hub. Evangeline also provides connectivity to BLM’s Sulphur distribution system and storage facilities located near the emerging Lake Charles petrochemical corridor.

COMMITMENT TO SAFETY, HEALTH & THE ENVIRONMENT

BPP is committed to the protection of the public and the environment through the safe operation and maintenance of its pipeline systems. BPP’s qualified personnel are trained in emergency response activities and regularly participate in drills and exercises reflecting various types of response levels, emergency scenarios, topographic terrain and environmental sensitivities. BPP has committed the necessary resources to fully prepare and implement its emergency response plans.

COMMUNICATIONS

BPP utilizes its 24-hour Pipeline Control Center (1-844-337-8234) as a hub of communications in emergency response situations.

The Control Center has a vast catalog of resources and capabilities. On-site communications are conducted using cellular telephones, portable radios, satellite phones and/or land-line telephone systems from company facilities and offices.

PIPELINE LOCATION AND MARKERS

The purpose of a pipeline marker is to identify a pipeline right-of-way and to provide information about BPP’s pipelines including operator name; phone numbers, in case of a possible emergency; and the product inside. Markers indicate the general, not exact, location of a pipeline and do not necessarily follow a straight course between two markers. Never rely solely on the presence or absence of pipeline markers - someone may have moved or removed the marker.

IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY

Emergency preparedness and planning measures are in place at BPP in case a pipeline incident occurs. BPP also works closely with local emergency response organizations to educate them regarding our pipelines and how to respond in the unlikely event of an emergency.

Should an emergency occur, BPP’s objective is to resolve the situation quickly and safely. Two-way communication with emergency responders is critical for this resolution. BPP needs immediate access to the incident location in order to assess and develop a plan to resolve the situation.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Community awareness is the key to maintaining public confidence in our operational integrity. Sharing information with the public and government officials is good business. This element defines the critical activities for informing, educating and cooperating with the communities in which we operate.
