



**ABOUT THE CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI GAS DEPARTMENT**

The City of Corpus Christi Gas Department is a natural gas distribution system spanning 1,509 miles within the city limits of Corpus Christi, TX. The City of Corpus Christi Gas Department's pipeline system and facilities are located throughout the city.

**WHAT DOES THE CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI GAS DEPARTMENT DO IF A LEAK OCCURS?**

To prepare for the event of a leak, pipeline companies regularly communicate, plan and train with local emergency responders. Upon the notification of an incident or leak, the pipeline company will immediately dispatch trained personnel to assist emergency responders.

Pipeline operators and emergency responders are trained to protect life, property and facilities in the case of an emergency.

Pipeline operators will also take steps to minimize the amount of product that leaks out and to isolate the pipeline emergency.

**MAINTAINING SAFETY AND INTEGRITY OF PIPELINES**

The City of Corpus Christi Gas Department invests significant time and capital maintaining the quality and integrity of its pipeline systems. Gas department personnel continually monitor the pipeline system and assess changes in pressure and flow. They notify field personnel if there is a possibility of a leak.

Gas transmission, hazardous liquid and distribution pipeline operators have developed supplemental hazard and assessment programs known as Integrity Management Programs (IMPs).
